The ADM yield factor is calculated by dividing the district's FY 2015 100-day ADM (including ADM of district sponsored charter schools) by the number of existing housing units in that district as of the middle of the fiscal year (December 31, 2014). The ADM of district sponsored charter schools is included in the calculation due to the fact that the district sponsored charter schools that started after June 30, 2013 and before July 1, 2014 have been reverted to district schools in FY 2016, and those that started prior to July 1, 2013 are intended to be phased out by FY 2017.
